Q: WHAT CAN I DONATE?

College textbooks and study guides (with copyright dates from the past 5 years), **any book recently used in a college class, trade paperbacks, workbooks** (with no missing pages), **in general, books that cover college subject matter:** (Math, Science, Business, Literature, Engineering, Health, Psychology, Foreign Language, History, Business, Philosophy, Sociology, Computer Science, Anthropology, Government, etc.) Highlighting and/or writing in books is fine, and accompanying CD's are great to send along as well.

ALSO...

Older textbooks (mostly with copyright dates over 5 years old), **dictionaries and thesauruses, DVDs & books on CD** (must be operable include original artwork and casing), **gently used children's books** (Newbery Winners probably will qualify), **mass-market paperbacks** ("supermarket" novels; usually 5"x7", like Crichton, Grisham, romance novels)

PLEASE DO NOT DONATE

Books in poor condition (dirty, moldy, missing pages, torn/missing cover, excessive water damage), **course packets** (made at a copy center, not technically a book), **custom publications** (when a professor compiles a 'book' specific to a class), **academic Journals or literary criticisms, encyclopedia sets, magazines or periodicals, books with no ISBN** (International Standard Book Number, the way all books after 1970 are catalogued), **case law and procedural law books, directories or telephone books**
